





This month room 1 talked about the winter season and identified things that are seen during the winter time. We made snowmen for our bulletin board and we made penguins. We brought in snow from outside and played with it. We watched it melt and we had a lot of fun. We also read the book "The Mitten". We colored and decorated our own mittens. On the snowy days that we were in school, we loved watching the snow fall as we looked out of our classroom window.

The Shining Stars (Room 4)

In the month of January we celebrated the birthdays of Brehane, Fiorella and Joshua, Our beginning theme was winter. During circle we discussed what we wear in winter to keep warm. Then we decorated mittens and hats. We also enjoyed making snowmen and snowflakes and painting with ice-cubes. It was a very chilly but fun craft to do. We also learned about Dr. Martin Luther King, JR. and his belief in peace. We spent time making items for our bulletin board. We colored in a picture of Dr. King and we did handprints in which we put our dreams for the world. Our board came out so awesome! Following our board, we worked on symbols of peace including our 3-D dove and peace symbol. Our next theme was community helpers. We colored a picture of each helper and made 3-D objects representing them

The Caterpillars (Room 5)

January was Community Helper (social studies) month. The Caterpillars celebrate our new month/year through songs, storybooks, arts and crafts, Guest speakers (John Bowman-Cardiologist), cooking projects, and utilizing our classroom work stations. Let us not forget to mention how much fun we've had with the winter weather. We played outside in the snow, painted, and used the snow and ice for science experiments.

The Fireflies (Room 6)

We provided opportunities for children to read recognize and write "2011"; used math vocabulary to compare two or more sets; and sorted objects by color, size and other attributes. We explored how many ways children can arrange two sets in order to get 5 as the sum using connecting cubes. Children manipulate a snowman chart as we sing "Five Little snowmen fat" and each verse a snowman melts. Each verse they subtract one by removing one snowman and adjusting the number. We learned about what made Martin Luther King, Jr. great and how we can be a role model like he was. We provided opportunities for children to recognize, write, and list words beginning with these letters: B,M, and S. We read, retold, and dramatized "The Three Bears" using puppets and props.
