The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has advised Abington Township to reduce the amount of sediment and nutrients dischared to our waterways. We can all help achieve this goal by doing our part to keep grass clippings, leaf litter and yard fertilizers out of the street where they can find their way to our local waterways and decompose into sediment.

Excess nutrients in lawn fertilizers, especially when applied incorrectly, are carried off by stormwater runoff and enter our local streams leading to algae blooms that are not only unpleasant to look at but also degrade water quality and aquatic habitats.

Abington Township Receives First Ever ADL Award

Abington Township once again finds itself in a position of honor. The Anti-Defamation League (ADL) has presented the Township with the first Barry Morrison Courageous Conversations Award. This newly created award honors ADL Regional Director Barry Morrison for his 30 years of commitment to the cause of the ADL. Beginning with Abington, it will be presented annually to a school or community that has demonstrated creativity and courage in engaging in dialogue about diversity.

The Abington Board of Commissioners adopted the 'No Place for Hate' Proclamation in 2002, making Abington one of the first 'No Place for Hate' communities in Pennsylvania. The proclamation states that citizens will work to interrupt prejudice and stop those who would hurt, harass, or violate the civil rights of anyone. Abington's dedicated efforts over the years have won the community a special place. ADL Project Director Lisa Stewart points out that when the ADL wants to focus others on a model 'No Place for Hate' community, they hold up Abington as the ideal.

Abington was one of the first communities to have all of its schools designated as 'No Place for Hate', including Penn State Abington (the first college campus). Many other organizations have signed, including the Abington Civic Club, Abington Community Taskforce, Abington YMCA, Glenside Kiwanis Club, Jenkintown Day Nursery, to name just a few.
