Woman killed by car

A 75-year-old woman was killed Saturday night while crossing Ridge Avenue near Walnut Lane, in Roxborough, police said.

Claire McNulty, of Mitchell Street near Pensdale Avenue, in Roxborough, was struck by a 1999 Honda about 6:35 p.m. She was pronounced dead at Roxborough Memorial Hospital, police said. The driver of the vehicle remained at the scene and the case remains under investigation.

Camden man guilty in slaying

Marcus K. Perkins, 33, of Yorkship Road, Camden, was convicted by a Superior Court jury Friday of aggravated manslaughter and related charges in the killing of Vincent Latta, 68, on Dec. 2, 2005.

The prosecution said that Perkins conspired with his paramour, April Latta, to kill her husband, who was strangled with a clothesline in his garage.

Perkins took Latta's silver Chrysler LHS with the victim's body in the trunk and left it in Camden.

April Latta pleaded guilty to aggravated manslaughter and robbery, and will be sentenced along with Perkins on Jan. 16.

Coast Guard rescues 4

The Coast Guard yesterday rescued four people who were aboard a 21-foot boat, It's About Time, which was experiencing engine trouble in the Delaware River off Philadelphia. The bost and crew were towed by a rescue team to the National Park Public Bost Ramp, near Philadelphia.

Someone fired several bullets into the campaign van for Bill Neff, a write-in state Senate candidate, when it was parked at a diner in Manheim Township, near Lancaster, early Saturday.


